## YOU AND YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFT

Romans 12:3-8

Introduction: Last time we discovered these four truths about spiritual gifts:

- 1. God has given every Christian a unique **SPIRITUAL GIFT.**
- 2. True **FULFILLMENT** comes from using our spiritual gift.
- 3. Spiritual gifts help **PERFECT** the body of Christ,
- 4. Spiritual gifts can be **DIVIDED** into three categories: (1) Gifts (2) Ministries, and (3) Effects. (1 Corinthians 12:4-6)

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Definition of the Gift	Characteristics of the Gift	Dangers of the Gift
1. PROPHECY Presenting God's Word to convict people of sin and their need for a right relationship with God.	<ul> <li>Persuasive</li> <li>Ability speak well</li> <li>Highly opinionated</li> <li>Discerning – able to evaluate character and motives of others</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Proud of speech</li> <li>Depends on speaking skills rather than Holy Spirit</li> <li>Insensitive to others' feelings</li> </ul>
SERVIING     Meeting the practical needs of others.	<ul> <li>Desires appreciation but doesn't need much public recognition</li> <li>Able to detect the personal needs of others</li> <li>Willing to overlook personal discomfort to meet needs</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Becoming bitter when not appreciated</li> <li>Over-emphasis on meeting practical versus spiritual needs</li> <li>Judging others who don't have this gift</li> </ul>
3. TEACHING  Presenting and clarifying Biblical truth.	<ul> <li>Enjoys researching Biblical truth</li> <li>Tests knowledge of others</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Concentrating on content versus application</li> <li>Becoming prideful of knowledge</li> <li>Inattentive to response of audience</li> </ul>

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4. EXHORTATION  Helping people solve problems by applying God's Word to their lives.	<ul> <li>Gifted in counseling</li> <li>Usually prefers one-on-one counseling to groups</li> <li>Likes to see practical application</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Wasting time with those not wanting real solutions</li> <li>Becoming discouraged by lack of progress</li> </ul>
5. GIVING Using personal assets to further God's Kingdom.	<ul> <li>Uses personal assets to further God's Kingdom</li> <li>Usually likes to give anonymously</li> <li>Dislikes pressure appeals</li> <li>Wants to motivate others to give as well</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Prideful of giving</li> <li>Over-emphasis on material needs</li> <li>Equating spirituality with material success</li> </ul>
6. LEADING Coordinating activities of others to achieve common goals.	<ul> <li>Sees the "big picture"</li> <li>Effective at delegation</li> <li>Able to preside</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Sometimes viewed as using people for the achievement of a goal</li> <li>Sometimes seen as pushy</li> <li>Tendency to lose sight for the ministry purpose of the goal</li> </ul>
7. MERCY Identifying with and comforting those who are hurting.	<ul> <li>Ability to discern the mood and spirit of the individual that he is dealing with</li> <li>Extremely sensitive to words or actions that hurt people</li> <li>Reacts negatively to those who are insensitive to the feelings of others</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Failure to be firm</li> <li>Resentful to others who lack the gift of mercy</li> <li>Misunderstood by the opposite sex</li> </ul>
