

Archaeology and the Old Testament: **Ten Significant Discoveries** Dr. Eugene Merrill – Teacher

Etymologically, "archaeology" involves the "study of old things." The dictionary definition is "the scientific study of material remains (as fossil relics, artifacts, monuments) of past human life and activities." The adjectives "biblical" or "Old Testament" limit the field of endeavor to a search for antiquities in the world of the Bible that enlightens it and the times and circumstances of which it speaks. The intent of this course is to explore briefly the history, methods, objectives, and conclusions of Old Testament archaeology with special attention to how its findings may legitimately or illegitimately be used to clarify, support, correct, or otherwise address the biblical text.

Dr. Eugene Merrill is a retired distinguished Professor of Old Testament Studies at Dallas Theological Seminary. Among his many degrees, he holds a M.A. and Ph.D. from New York University and an M.Phil. from Columbia University. Dr. Merrill has been heavily involved in international Christian ministry in Europe, Asia, and the Near East.


