Daniel: Diet, Den, Dreams

Dr. Charles Ryrie – Teacher

Captured and exiled from his homeland, Daniel lived most of his life under dictatorial rulers without compromising his faith in the true God. He also was a decoder of dreams and visions, which included events that happened in his day, others which would occur in future centuries, and even some that have yet to be fulfilled in our day (but will be some day).

Once again, we are thrilled to have Dr. Charles Ryrie teaching in Discipleship University. Not only has Dr. Ryrie been a member of First Baptist Dallas for over 50 years, he is also a well-known Christian writer and theologian who served as Professor of Systematic Theology and Dean of Doctoral Studies at Dallas Theological Seminary. He is best known for his Ryrie Study Bible that has sold more than two million copies and enriched the lives of untold numbers of Christians.

Beyond this general affirmation though, believers do have significantly differing opinions on how the details of this event will unfold. Why is that? In this class, we will survey the main reasons why believers express opposing viewpoints on Christ's return and examine these actual perspectives. If you wonder why believers are not always on the same page regarding the way Christ will bring history to a glorious end, then this course is for you.

Dr. Everett Berry serves as Professor of Theology at Criswell College and is the editor for the Criswell Theological Review. He and his wife, Tabitha, have been members of First Baptist Dallas for 10 years.

Strange Kingdoms

(Chaos of the Cults - Part 2, not a prerequisite to the class last Spring) Dr. Iim Wicker – Teacher

We will examine strange kingdoms and how they differ from what the Bible says: (1) selected recent cults, (2) problematic teachings in Christian churches (on the verge of becoming cults), and (3) the occult. Examples of these 3 groups include (1) House of Yahweh, Fundamentalist Communes, (2) Faith Healers, Oprah Spiritualism, Latter-Day Apostles, Prosperity Gospel, Word of Knowledge, and (3) Astrology, Divination, Kabbalah, Satanism, Spiritism, Superstitions, and Wicca. We will learn how to effectively share the gospel with members of each of these peculiar groups.

Dr. Wicker is the Director of Web-Based Education and Associate Professor of New Testament at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He is a deacon in our church, and he teaches the Parents of Teens and Preteens Sunday School class.

Dr. Solganick is a gifted Professor of Humanities, Philosophy, Apologetics, and History of Ideas at The College at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Ft. Worth. He is also a faithful member of our church and teaches the Mission Minded Sunday School class.

Principles of Teaching

Dr. Jack Terry – Teacher

This class examines the major principles that take teaching from mundane to exceptional. The study is centered on helping the veteran or new teacher ask pertinent questions about present teaching styles and how those can be enhanced. Since you have been teaching adults, and doing it well, this gives indication that you are an excellent teacher. But have you ever asked yourself, "Are there some little things I could be doing better with what I am already doing well? Are there some keys that I could add to my teaching ability that could make me a better teacher than what I presently am?" You will also learn the following:

- The difference between teaching in a Christian context versus a secular context
- How to determine what your class needs to learn, not what vou want to teach
- How to write effective teaching plans that will be usable immediately with your class

Dr. Terry has served as the Minister of Education for five churches prior to joining the faculty of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. For many years, Dr. Terry was Dean of the School of Religious Education at Southwestern. He is currently Professor of Foundations of Education, Vice President Emeritus for Institutional Advancement, and Special Assistant to the President of Southwestern.

He was also Coordinator of Jewish Ministries for the North American Mission Board and is now a professor of Jewish Studies. Having received so much by growing up at First Baptist Dallas, Jim has had the opportunity to give back-by teaching young adults in the past and now in Discipleship University.




