
Unlocking the Secrets of the Feasts

Young adults in America are abandoning the Christian faith at alarming rates. Pew Research Center found that, among young adults, a full 34 percent do not affiliate with any religion while only 22 percent identify as Evangelicals. By comparison, among the Baby Boomers, 28 percent are Evangelicals and only 17 percent are unaffiliated. Why has our culture moved so far away from the faith upon which it was founded? Part of the reason has been the rise of secularism. Americans can proudly reject any faith, and they are considered prudent for doing so. Faith is blind, weak, and ignorant—or so say the intellectual elite. But is faith blind? In this class, we will look at the true meaning of faith by answering some tough questions:

- Doesn't everyone have faith in something?
- How do faith and science work together?
- What evidence is there for Christianity?
- Can we really believe in life after death?






